ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE (ESL) OVERVIEW

Adults who wish to improve their English language skills and who meet the Requirements listed below may participate in ESL classes in VRABE's 14-town region.

The focus is on developing the skills and knowledge needed for success in home, community, workplace, and academic settings. Students practice by speaking, listening, reading, and writing. Classes are small to allow for active participation. This is a wonderful opportunity to experience a variety of cultures, and to develop English skills in a supportive setting.

ESL Admission Requirements

The student must:

1. Be 17 years of age or older and not enrolled in a public school. Students ages 17 and 18 must provide proof of withdrawal from a Connecticut school.
2. Provide a current, valid, government photo ID including signature (such as passport, driver's license, or a CT photo ID issued by the Department of Motor Vehicles). If your ID doesn't have your current address, bring in a piece of mail, lease, or utility bill with your current address on it.
3. Complete a Student Information Form.
4. Take required pre-tests and post-tests. The teacher will use this information to help meet the instructional needs of the student.
5. Sign Student Signature Page (pg.7) to indicate you have reviewed the Student Handbook yourself or your teacher has reviewed it with you. Sign the Online Access Form (page 8) stating that you will follow the rules for use of online resources at VRABE. Return both signed forms to your teacher.

Additional Learning Opportunities for ESL Students

CITIZENSHIP

This class is for adults who wish to become United States citizens and is held online (virtual).

FAMILY LEARNING PROGRAM (includes childcare)

This program meets 3 days a week at The Lutheran Church of St. Mark in Glastonbury (ESL and GED)

It offers students the chance to:

- Improve their English language skills OR prepare to complete their GED® (high school diploma)
- Develop parenting skills and learn how to become a partner in their child's education
- Have their children participate in activities led by the YMCA staff

Additional Learning Opportunities (cont.)

AUDITING A VRABE COURSE FOR FREE

High intermediate and advanced VRABE ESL students may be eligible to take a FREE VRABE class in our Credit Diploma or ABE, GED® program at one of our VRABE sites. Please go to your site administrator for more information about which courses are accepting students. Then you will need to:

1. Get the teacher’s approval that the course is appropriate for you.
2. Attend class on a regular basis and do the assignments, or you will be dropped from the course.
3. Understand that no credit will be given for this course.

FREE CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION COURSES

High intermediate and advanced VRABE ESL students may be able to take FREE career and technical education (CTE) courses in Storrs, Manchester, and other sites. Examples include Customer Service, ServSafe, MS WORD, Culinary Arts, CAD (Computer Aided Design). It may be possible to earn national certification through these courses.

HIGH SCHOOL COMPLETION PROGRAMS

Registration and an orientation are required for the four high-school completion programs described below. Visit www.vrabe.org and click on Academic Programs, scroll down to Registration Resources.

GED® TEST PREPARATION CLASS.

- This class prepares students to pass the GED® test which covers four areas—Reasoning through Language Arts, Mathematical Reasoning, Science and Social Studies.
- Day and evening GED® classes are offered at many locations throughout the VRABE region. · GED® testing is held weekly at Rockville High School in Vernon.

ABE CLASS - This class is designed to help students who need to develop additional skills in basic reading, writing, and math before enrolling in a high school completion program.

CREDIT DIPLOMA PROGRAM (CDP) - Earn a high school diploma through a 23 credit (minimum) course of study). CDP is offered at William Johnston Middle School (Colchester), E.O. Smith High School (Storrs), Griswold High School and Rockville High School in Vernon.

NATIONAL EXTERNAL DIPLOMA PROGRAM (NEDP) - This computer-based program is based at Rockville High School in Vernon and available in-person in all towns we serve. It is ideal for students:

- who want to complete a high school diploma
- who are motivated and self-directed
- who can work independently and with a mentor

CONTINUING ED ENRICHMENT PROGRAMS - A tuition fee is charged for these classes which cover Art, Health in Mind and Body, Computers, Cooking, Crochet, Quilting, Dance, Exercise and Sports, Floral Design, Financial Planning, Industrial Arts, Jewelry Making and more.
