

## ***Working with Adobe PDF Files***

Adobe's Portable Document Format (PDF) is a file format that is used primarily to distribute files across a network or on a website. To view and use the files, you need the free Adobe Reader which can be easily downloaded. Once Adobe Reader is downloaded, it will start on its own whenever you want to view a PDF file. PDF file formats are useful for viewing magazine articles, brochures, and informational pages because all text and image layouts remain as designed. PDF files, may be viewed, saved, and printed but not changed using the free Reader. Additional costly software is necessary to change PDF files.

### **To open a pdf file:**

- If you already have Adobe Acrobat Reader installed, click on the file to browse it without downloading it (Reader will automatically open the file)

### **To download/save a pdf file:**

- Right mouse click on the pdf file. In the resulting dialog box, click on **Save Target As**
- When **Save In** dialog box opens, select where you want file saved.
- Once PDF file has been downloaded, use the Adobe Acrobat reader to view or print the file.
